Admissions and the Learner Profile

Keeping this in mind, our admissions policy reflects our commitment to admitting students who embody the values and characteristics of the IB Learner Profile.

Inquirers: We seek students who display a natural curiosity and eagerness to acquire knowledge. During the admissions process, we value students who demonstrate a willingness to explore and investigate various subject areas.

Knowledgeable: Applicants who possess a strong foundation of knowledge across various disciplines are encouraged to apply. We appreciate students who exhibit intellectual curiosity and a desire to engage in meaningful learning experiences.

Thinkers: RCS welcomes students who are critical and creative thinkers. We look for individuals who can demonstrate their ability to apply critical thinking skills, analyze information, and generate innovative ideas.

Communicators: Effective communication is vital in our diverse and interconnected world. We seek students who can express themselves clearly and confidently, both orally and in writing, during the admissions process.

Principled: We value students who exhibit strong ethical principles, honesty, and integrity. As part of the admission process, applicants are expected to act with integrity and adhere to the highest standards of ethical behavior.

Connections to other IB Policies

Admissions and Language

At RCS, we recognize the importance of a solid foundation in a student's mother tongue for academic success. As part of the admissions process, we assess a student's language profile based on their previous academic performance. It is essential that applicants demonstrate ageappropriate literacy and proficiency in a language.

To facilitate effective communication and integration into our academic programs, all previous school records must be translated into English for evaluation purposes.

For students entering RCS in the DP 1 year, proficiency in Academic English is crucial for engaging with course materials and successfully sitting the DP examinations. Therefore, language proficiency assessments are conducted as part of the admissions process specifically for DP 1 applicants.

If a student is deemed incapable of accessing information and expressing themselves at an appropriate level, their admission to RCS may be reconsidered.

Once admitted, students will be required to complete a comprehensive Language Profile questionnaire for all languages offered at RCS. This information will assist in determining the appropriate language group placement. Within two weeks of enrollment, language teachers will assign newly admitted students to the language group that aligns best with their proficiency level.



In our efforts to maintain diversity among our student body while considering available resources and class composition, we strive to balance the levels of language proficiency.

Admissions and Assessment

In the DP programme, we assess admissions based on 2-year reports, an evaluation form, any school documents, English and Maths admission tests, and an interview. If it is a remote applicant, students may be required to engage in a face-to-face Google Meet or Zoom meetings.

Application Timing

Our application process takes place on a yearly basis starting from January for August entry; our school years run from August to June.

High School Applicants

IB Diploma Programme Admission closes 1st September each year. After 1st September, RCS will only accept new students who are transferring from an IB DP program with all subjects that can be accommodated by RCS.

Acceptance Criteria



All students are still required to follow the admissions process completely to be considered for admissions. A decision for acceptance is only made after the appropriate members of staff evaluate the above information in accordance with our Inclusion Policy and Language Policy.

For applicants to the Diploma Programme, RCS provides guidance regarding subject choices that align with their individual strengths and future academic goals. However, it's important to note that the school cannot guarantee approval for all DP subject choices if our evaluation determines a low probability of success in those particular subjects.

We aim to support students in selecting subjects that will enable them to thrive academically and pursue their desired pathways. Our evaluation process takes into account various factors such as academic performance, aptitude, and readiness to handle the rigor of specific DP subjects.

While we strive to accommodate students' preferences, it is essential to ensure that they have a realistic chance of achieving success in their chosen subjects. By considering multiple factors, we aim to provide guidance that maximizes students' potential and sets them up for a fulfilling academic experience.

Siblings are prioritised for all grade levels however, Diploma Programme students applying from other IB Schools are given priority when applying.

Notice of Acceptance

- Acceptance letters are emailed out to the address on file
- A deposit is required before the spot is confirmed

On the First Day of School

- All new parents and students will be invited to meet the Head of Admissions and the Head of School in the school reception for the first day of school.
- DP students will be met in the reception by the DP coordinator and led to their classes.
